iBarista Competition



I am also very grateful to my coaches, teachers and especially my teammates who pushed me beyond my limits throughout this NSG and making this experience a very fulfilling one.





Do You Know?

Outram Swimming Pool

The idea for the pool was first mooted in 1972 by the then SAC Chairman, Mr David Chew. Fundraising the building of the swimming complex was carried out through two walkathons and one fun fair.

The Outram swimming pool was officially opened in 1977 after 8 months of construction. It is a $25m \times 21m$ short course pool with eight lanes for competition swimming and a grandstand which can hold up to 300 people.





Sporting Achievements

Water Polo in Outram started in 1991, and the "B" Division Boys won the Inter-school Water Polo Competition for the first time in 2013 (22 years after the pool was built) and again in 2017.

Ardi Azman (Class of 2020) is the first male Malay national swimmer who earned a place in the SEA Games and Asian Games squads.
